Given the dry season most trees survived well


The scarlet oak next to the long lagoon was removed due a large fallen branch and rot meaning it could not be pollarded or otherwise saved.

#### **General Business**

Josie the daughter of John and Cath Murphy re donating a tree in memory of her parents. I explained about the no plaques policy and she fully agreed. We can nominate the tree we would like to plant — the family would like a claret ash or something similar, and they will donate to the Landcare fund to cover the cost. We would provide acknowledgment on our website of the donation and a short history of the Murphy's and their contribution to South Gippsland.

Dick will find some trees to recommend to the family.

We would like the Shire to report on the ten most urgent trees for maintenance.

We will begin a tree audit at the next working bee (July) to augment any shire arborist assessments. We hope that being able to flag trees that need further assessment will be helpful.

Jeremy would like the Moss era trees at Knockwood (formally the Moss nursery site above Mossvale Park) to be labelled. This would be especially useful if we did combined Mossvale Park walks and Knockwood estate visits.

Could we measure the Knockwood trees re future National Trust listing. After the next working bee we could start.

Ist of March 2026 Rotary sponsored music for the people style concert in the park, with potential for a park tour. There is a large range of local musical talent in SG to draw on. Would like the concert to include a donation for the park.

John Hawker has identified a Loquat leaved Oak - *Quercus rysophylla* - from Leongatha North. Native to Mexico. We could propagate a specimen for the park.
